SAN JOSE, Calif. — Are you a teen (aged 12 – 18) that performs with your own band? Ready to move out of the garage and onto a wider stage? Enter San José Public Library's online "Battle of the Bands," in celebration of Teen Tech Week 2009.

"Wait," you say. "Online? How do I do that?" It's simple. Have your parents or a friend grab that camcorder and record your best performance. Post the video online (e.g., MySpace, YouTube, Pure Volume, etc.). Submit your entry, by sending an email to **[sjplbattleofthebands@gmail.com](mailto:sjplbattleofthebands@gmail.com)** that contains a link to your online performance. Be sure to include the following information:

- The name of the band/performer, and names and ages of all members
- A brief description of the band, to be used on the contest webpage
- A name, phone number, and email where the contestants can be reached

**The deadline to enter is February 14.** Please note: No personal information will be posted online.

This contest is open to all musical genres, but no obscene or offensive lyrics are allowed. Inappropriate lyrics or behavior will result in disqualification. Participants may enter together as a group, or as a solo performer. Solo performers must play an

accompanying instrument. No karaoke permitted. Those interested in singing are encouraged to watch for announcements of our citywide talent competition, coming in April to a San Jose library near you.

Contestants who do not yet have music videos online may participate in one of the two video recording sessions taking place in February. Performers may bring their gear and perform a song, which will be recorded by library staff and then uploaded, online, as a video. Recording sessions are scheduled at the following San Jose locations:

- **Wednesday, February 11, 4-7 p.m.** – West Valley Branch Library,  
1243 San Tomas Aquino Road
- **Saturday, February 14, 3:30-5:30pm** – Tully Community Branch Library,  
880 Tully Road

What's next? Your entry will be posted on the official "SJPL Battle of the Bands" website. Music lovers will be invited to visit the page between February 18 and 28 to listen in and cast their votes for their favorites. **The top five finalists who receive the most online votes will be announced and contacted March 3rd.**

The top five finalists from the online voting contest must be available to play the live final concert on **Saturday, March 14** at the Almaden Branch Library (6445 Camden Ave, San Jose). The play-off battle begins at 2 p.m. and each band will have up to 20 minutes to perform their set.

A panel of judges will use a 10-point scale to evaluate the performers on:

- Musical ability — vocal/instrumental skill, fluidity, intonation
- Originality — quality original material or quality interpretation of covers
- Professionalism — set-up and breakdown time, introductions, acknowledgements
- Stage presence/style — appearance, actions, audience enthusiasm

**Teen Tech Week**

Teen Tech Week is a national initiative sponsored by the Young Adult Library Services Association and is aimed at teens, their parents, educators and other concerned adults. The purpose of the initiative is to ensure that teens are competent and ethical users of technologies, especially those that are offered through libraries such as DVDs, databases, audiobooks, and videogames. Teen Tech Week encourages teens to use libraries' non-print resources for education and recreation, and to recognize that librarians are qualified, trusted professionals in the field of information technology. Teen Tech Week began in 2007 and has a general theme of Get Connected @ your library.
